Voting was held for annual elected positions at the Virginia GIS conference on April 11th and 12th, and by-proxy voting was made available to members via email link. The following executive officers will begin their term on July 1, 2023.

President: Jennifer Ciminelli

Jennifer is an environmental scientist and educator, with over twenty-three years of experience focused on the use of spatial analysis for conservation planning, green infrastructure modeling, urban greening, and environmental planning. Jennifer has worked in a variety of roles during her career, including a geospatial project manager, GIS Coordinator for a local government, green infrastructure planner for natural resource agencies, and now, educator and researcher. She is currently an assistant professor in the Center for Environmental Studies at Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond, Virginia. Jennifer develops and teaches courses at the Center, and has worked to build the geospatial program. She has worked on a variety of client driven and grant funded projects throughout her career. Her research program is focused on using geospatial analyses to frame and explore issues related to the environment, and to help inform policy related to preserving and enhancing the sustainability and resiliency of our communities and environment.
