Description: Mr. Charles Edward McNoldy is one of the founding members of VAMLIS. He served our country for 27 years in the U.S. Army, where he was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal for his career as a registered land surveyor and a registered professional engineer. He also served as the Director of the (then) Office of Mapping and Information Resources for Prince William County Government, where he supervised the development and implementation of the county's first Geographic Information System.

This award is in honor of Mr. Charles Edward McNoldy and will be awarded to a student in a Virginia university or college majoring in Geographic Information Systems, a geospatial related field, or other majors with a career or program area focus on Geographic Information Systems.

To apply for this scholarship the student needs to provide an official academic transcript along with a 500-word minimum essay detailing why said student should be the recipient of this scholarship, what the student is working on in school and their long-term goals for the future.
